WHAT? WHY? CHILDREN IN HOSPITAL

You may recall us telling you that the Scottish Association for Children with Heart Disorders funded a video made by What? Why? Children in Hospital (WWCIH) showing what happens during a treadmill exercise tolerance test.

What? Why? Children in Hospital are a Scottish charity who produce valuable videos explaining various hospital tests and investigations performed on children and give helpful suggestions on how to prepare children for them (<https://www.whatwhychildreninhospital.org.uk/>).

WWCIH are currently producing a new video looking at what adolescence is like for those with a heart condition. They are keen to address some of the issues commonly faced in order to help young people across Scotland and are looking for teens, young adults and grown ups to take part in its filming.

The video is being made in collaboration with the cardiology, psychology, and play specialist teams at Glasgow and will be funded by SACHD.

Filming is set to take place in Glasgow at the end of November.

Young people have the option of being filmed speaking to the camera or being filmed anonymously, if they would prefer. Animations will be used in the video.

If you or your son or daughter would be willing to participate in the project please get in touch and we can pass your contact on to Marit Boot, the founder of WWCIH.

Marit will then be in touch with you to explain more and to answer any questions.
